NEWS IN BRIEF:

25th **Anniversary Dinner** – Unfortunately, the ACF annual event has been postponed until further notice. Given the current situation we will not be holding any events until it is safe to do so.

Welcome Home – Following our flood appeal and due to generous donations received from the ACF community, emergency repair works have successfully completed on time and the home, including the kitchenette has become fully functional. Further building works will be carried out to strengthen and protect the home from future damage caused by bad weather.

space (India) – ACF has taken over assistance to 20 children from the Muniyandipuram area in the Madurai district and will be supported through a newly established foster care scheme. Unfortunately, in order to comply with COVID-19 related Government guidance, evening school has been temporarily closed until further notice. However, ACF will continue to provide financial assistance. In addition, the Government has taken over support of special needs employees as part of the COVID-19 guidance.

The Church of America Ceylon Mission (CACM)

organisation is in the process of restructuring and revaluating its strategic priorities as part of its recovery from the pandemic in 2020 and the Easter bombings in 2019. During this process we have come to a mutual agreement that they no longer require our support as their work does not fall entirely within our charity's remit. ACF has been supporting CACM for almost ten years — through this we have been able to support vulnerable children and their families immediately after the war ended.

Patron Fr James memorial

In honour of ACF's founder Patron Fr James
Pathinathan a memorial has been erected by
the Parish of Mullaitivu within the Tsunami
memorial compound in Mullaitivu. During the
2004, Fr James' played a crucial role in
rescuing several people to safety. The statue
itself was revealed on Boxing Day 2020,
exactly 16 years following the tragic event.
This is a great tribute to a selfless Priest who
put humanity over religion.

She is now able to attend school and tuition classes in evenings and at weekends.




FUNDRAISING NEWS:
