Tuition Scheme - Arobanam Boys Home

We recently identified that a number of our children at Arobanam Boys Home, Kilinochchi were underperforming at school. Many of these children had their schooling interrupted as a consequence of the civil war and displacement.

As such, we have now launched a new tuition scheme to provide these children with extra classes in core subjects (Maths, English, Science & Tamil) to ensure they are given the best opportunity for education. The tuition scheme costs £235 per month and is currently being funded through our contingency fund which is not a sustainable solution.
